About the Position

Brock CHC is seeking a Primary Care Nurse Practitioner who shares our passion for community-focused health, and is motivated to make a lasting difference in a rural setting where their work will truly matter. In addition to a favourable work-life balance, nurse practitioners work as members of an interdisciplinary team that includes family physicians, nurses, social workers, physiotherapist, dietitian, diabetes educators, outreach workers and administrative staff.

Reporting:

This position reports to the Director of Clinical Services.

Key Responsibilities:

- At Brock CHC, all Nurse Practitioners care for their own panel of patients as the most responsible provider. Physicians are available for consult.
- Provide comprehensive primary health care emphasizing assessment, diagnostics, treatment, health education and disease prevention across the life span
- Provide appropriate follow-up, referrals, investigations and coordination of care as required

- Provide patient education, health promotion and preventative care as appropriate
- Maintain accurate, timely and confidential medical documentation in accordance with professional and organizational standards
- Strive to achieve provincial performance targets set by Ontario Health
- Promote a team-based, integrated approach to primary care that considers the patient's physical, mental, social and environmental health needs
- Share responsibility for the on-call coverage (telephone only) offered by Brock CHC
- Provide same-day services for clients with acute or urgent care needs
- Provide coverage for other primary care practitioners
- Work collaboratively with physicians, nurse practitioners, nurses, medical secretaries, allied health professionals and other members of the interdisciplinary CHC team

Qualifications/Experience:

- Completion of a recognized Primary Care Nurse Practitioner program
- Masters degree in Nursing; or equivalent recognized education and experience
- Current certification with the College of Nurses of Ontario – Extended Class and a member in good standing
- Alignment with the Centre's values – equity, confidentiality, compassion, collaboration, responsiveness, education and respect
- Experience as a Primary Care Nurse Practitioner working with all ages in a community health setting
- Experience working in rural, vulnerable or medically complex populations (preferred)
- Experience managing a patient panel/roster and providing longitudinal care (preferred)
- Knowledge of the health delivery system, community and social services and the relevant legislation related to Nurse Practitioners in Ontario
- Demonstrated leadership in promoting a shared responsibility for professional practice and development
- Proficiency with EMR systems
- Commitment to patient-centred, equitable and accessible health care
- Strong time management and organizational skills

This role will require some evening and potential weekend hours and home visits.
